With the I/M (Inspection/Maintenance) readiness check, you can see whether the vehicle's internal monitors have completed their self-tests. If the monitors show as "Not Ready", the vehicle may fail an emissions test. The scanner can tell you which specific monitors are incomplete, allowing you to drive the vehicle until they become ready.

Ease of Use and User Interface

The Actron CP 9175 is designed with simplicity in mind. It will read codes related to emissions, fuel systems, ignition systems, and drivetrain. However, it does **not** have the ability to read manufacturer-specific codes (such as those from BMW, Toyota, or Ford that go beyond generic standards). It also cannot diagnose systems like ABS, airbags, or climate control. For that, you would need a more advanced scanner with enhanced features.

Additionally, the Actron CP 9175 does not provide live data streaming in real-time like many professional scanners. It only shows freeze frame data and generic information at the time of code retrieval. It also lacks graphing capabilities and cannot perform bidirectional tests (such as commanding the fuel pump or activating solenoids). Despite these limitations, for the vast majority of check engine light issues, the CP 9175 provides all the information needed to identify the problem.

Real-World User Experiences and Reliability

While a \$15 generic scanner might read codes, it often lacks definitions, freeze frame, and I/M readiness checks. The CP 9175 offers these features at a moderate price, making it a strong value proposition.

Compared to Bluetooth OBD II adapters that work with a smartphone app, the Actron has the advantage of being a standalone device. It does not require a phone, app installation, or wireless connection. This makes it simpler and more reliable in situations where your phone's battery is low or you prefer a dedicated tool. However, smartphone-based scanners often provide more data and graphing capabilities. So the choice depends on your preference for simplicity versus advanced functionality.
